The Gathering of Quilters Guild Minutes from Nov 16, 2017 For Guild Approval

President Colleen Florkowski called the meeting to order. Diana Trost then introduced Julie Haas, our contact at Mom's House. Ms. Haas described the mission of Mom's House and how it is organized. Mom's House is a non-residential facility which provides a Five Star Early Childhood Center for low income children whose parent is enrolled in school fulltime. She invited members to tour the facility. The Gathering has chosen Mom's House as the recipient for this year's Challenge quilts.

The program for the evening was demonstrations of homemade Christmas items. Demonstrations were given by Diana Trost (placemats), Margie Stone (zippered bag and pillowcase), Ellen Bowers (Ohio mat/wall hanging), and Sheila Painter (Quickie Quilts).

Vikki Karnes and Kathy Kanitz suggested making and selling a raffle quilt as a fundraiser for the guild. Materials and labor would be provided by guild members. It was decided that two lap quilts would be made; one with an Ohio State University theme another with a University of Michigan theme. Raffle tickets would be sold with a drawing to occur in Nov. 2018. The Chairman for the OSU quilt is Beth Lenix We still need a Chairman for the U of M quilt. Donations of fabric and batting are needed, along with help with the sewing.

Beth Rohrbacher reported that 2017/2018 membership stands at 66 members. We had six returning members join this night and one guest in attendance.

The January program will be a Dessert Potluck and Schoolhouse Rules. Some of our members will be doing demos with their favorite rulers. The Fat Quarter theme is Brights.

The 50/50 raffle was for \$30 and won by Sue Todt.

Kathy Kanitz reported that the Retreat is filled and there are two people on the waiting list.

The Door Prize was awarded to Mary Steitz and the Fat Quarters were won by Diana Burkhardt and Debbie Linenkugel.



Gathering of Quilters Guild Challenge for 2017 - 2018

Mom's House Charity Quilt Challenge

Theme: "I Spy My ABC's and 1, 2. 3's"

Purpose: The quilts will be donated to Mom's House to be used / given to toddlers - kindergarten aged children. The theme is aimed at fun pre-school children learning / education. Your quilt can include I Spy, or ABC's, or 1, 2, 3's, or all of the above. The goal is a fun happy quilt which is about learning.

Mom's House Toledo is a 5-star childcare center available to help low-income, single moms graduate from high school, technical school and college. With intervention and support, they help single moms set and attain lifetime educational goals, and break the cycle of poverty for you and your children.

Mom's House strives to break the cycles of poverty and welfare. Their mission is to guide at-risk single parents through the process of achieving educational goals and provide tools and resources needed to become effective parents.

Guidelines / Rules

Members may make as many quilts as they desire for the guild charity, but only one quilt per member entered in the guild charity challenge is eligible for a prize.

The quilt entered in the challenge for a prize must be made entirely by a guild member.

The quilt should reflect the theme, "I Spy My ABC's and 1, 2, 3's". It may be:

Any color(s) or design

Be of a cheerful, happy appearance

Each quilt must consist of three layers – quilt top, batting, backing – and have a binding. There may be **no attached embellishments.**

The quilt must be quilted, versus tied, and, must be entirely machine washable and dryable.

The quilt size should be between 40" to 50" wide and 50" long.

Quilts are to be brought to the May 2018 meeting to be considered for voting. Members of the guild will vote for the quilts which best reflect the theme and quality workmanship. Winners will receive:

1st Place - \$75 Gift Certificate 2nd Place - \$50 Gift Certificate

3rd Place - \$25 Gift Certificate


