Show & Tell

Patty Miller displayed how to use any scraps for embellishing

**Program**: Susan Sansenbacher Smith presented her collection of buttons dating back several generations. In the 1800's women collected 999 buttons. After 1000 in the collection, the first man she met would become her husband.

She displayed many kinds of buttons including her ancestor's string of buttons on its original string over 100 years old. She shared the history of buttons types from the 1840's. They were made of metal, glass, wood, shell, antlers with and without shanks. Brought back memories and questions of buttons in our own collection in grandma's, mother-in-law's and our own button boxes.

## Basic Walker Pouch

#### by Sharon Moore

2 pieces of fabric 16 ½" by 54"

1 piece iron on fleece Pellon (can be pieced) 16  $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 54" 12" Velcro

4 1"by 18" fabric for ties (or grosgrain ribbon or twill)

Elmer's Washable white school glue

Optional: 4 8" finished orphan blocks. Sew 2 together then sew right sides together with

the sewn back fabric 38 ½" instead of 54".

Optional: 2 yards of ribbonor rickrack for ties.

Iron on fleece to one of the pieces of fabric.

With right sides together, sew the 2 pieces together leaving a 6" opening in the middle of one of the long sides to turn right side out.

Turn right side out and glue the opening shur. Iron to set the glue.

Fold both ends from the back to the front 9" each and pin. This makes the pockets. Your piece is now 36".

Make the ties and insert them 3" from the bottom on all sides. Put them in at least  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Top stitch close to the edge all around the 36" piece making sure to catch both sides of the glued opening and back stitsh at the top or each side of the pocket and at ties.

Find the center of each pocket and stitch to make two pockets on each side. (you may want them off center to make room for magazine or book.)

Sew across the center of 16" by 36" piece. (This is so it stays flat when washed.)

Fron the center of the stitching on the back, measure down 4" on each side and mark. Center the Velcro right below the 4" line and attach by stitching all around the Velcro.

Get creative and make them fun. Think of holiday or seasonal motifs.

Editor's note: If you have trouble with these instructions, you may figure out your own way, or come to the Guild meetings where Diana Trost will give a demo.

#### **CHALLENGE**

#### Theme: A Holiday Walk

This year our project is smaller, a walker pouch/bag, which you may keep, give to a friend, or donate to a nursing home. You may use your own pattern, find one of many online, or a free pattern designed and offered by Sharon Moore. (She won best of show at Sauders Quilt show in 2017. See photo on previous page.)

Pinterest also has many walker bags patterns, many free. Kwik Sew Crafts Totes & Bags-K3927, Simplicity 2096

#### Guidelines and Rules

- 1. Your quilt must be a bag/pouch that can be attached to a walker.
- 2. Your bag may be appliqued or pieced.
- 3. Your bag must be designed to celebrate a holiday of your choice. Attach a 3x5 card listing your holiday.
- 4. Members may make as many bags as they wish, but only 1 may be entered in the contest or be eligible for a prize.
- 5. The bag must be made entirely by a guild member.
- 6. Each bag must be 3 layers—top, batting and backing and be quilted, not tied.
- 7. No binding required.
- 8. Embellishments must be securely attached.
- 9. Winners will receive a gift certificate: 1st \$75, 2nd \$50, 3rd \$25

Diana's notes: on Sharon's pattern:

- 1. Ribbon or twill tape is much easier than making your ties on your own.
- 2. If using a directional design, remember that each end is a top.
