Minutes from March 21, 2019

President Rhonda Kistner called the meeting to order at 8:16 following a trunk show from Mary Clark.

Secretary Report: The February minutes had no corrections. Joyce Smith moved to accept the minutes, Sue Todt seconded. Approved.

Treasurer Report: Susie Todt reported that we have \$7,315.51 with an Income of \$69.00 and expenses of \$433.34. The current balance is \$6,951.17. Deb Linenkugel moved to accept the report, Linda Ball seconded. Approved.

Old Business: Program- Vicki Karnes reported that next month, April 18, Sue Wilson and her mom Betty will present Quilting Stories. November, 2019 will be a Stash Raffle. Gather things to donate to the guild. This has been a wonderful money maker for the guild. We will be doing a raffle quilt in November 2020. Looking for volunteers to take this on.

As a condition of using the meeting room, the church wants a list of the **charity donations** that we make. Please give your information to Sheila Painter.

Retreat: We are ready to go. Kathy Kanitz will be bringing chicken salad. It takes about 3 hours to get to Millersburg. Bring snacks for the snack table. There are refrigerators in the suites and sewing rooms. The hotel website has quilt shop lists. Bring additional lights as the rooms have dark walls.

Membership: Beth Rohrbacher said that we have four new members and five visitors tonight. Karen Rupp won the door prize.

Nomination Committee: We need a new Vice President whose job is to pick up the key, set up the room, put key away, take down the room and fill in for the President if needed. We also need a **Program**Chairman for 2020-21. Programs are set for 2019. If you want to do one of the other positions, tell the Nominating Committee. Treasurer, Sue Todt has agreed to stay. The goal is to have the names by the May meeting. Billie Syzmanski will be on the Nominating Committee. Please contact her if you are willing to help.

By Laws: Last revised in 2013. We added 3 meetings last year. Article 4- Officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer) may serve a maximum of 2 consecutive terms in any one office. Do we want to change?

Article 6- Full Board- The full board shall meet no fewer than 3 times each year if necessary.

Article 9- General Meetings- There shall be a minimum of 8 meetings per year September through May but no meeting in December. Corrections will be made and sent out to members. We will have discussion in April if needed and vote in May.

Project Linus: Billie Syzmanski requested quilts 42×64 for Project Linus as they are needing some quilts to be a little longer.

Newsletter: Give Hattie Kate Howell any cartoons or information to include in the newsletter along with things happening in the world of guilts.

A HOLIDAY WALK

This year our project is smaller, a walker pouch/bag, which you may keep, give to a friend, or donate to a nursing home. You may use your own pattern, find one of many online, or a free pattern designed and offered by Sharon Moore. Pinterest also has many walker bags patterns, many free.

GUIDELINES/RULES

- 1. Your quilt must be a bag/pouch that can be attached to a walker.
- 2. Your bag may be appliqued or pieced.
- 3. Your bag must be designed to celebrate a holiday of your choice. Attach a 3x5 card listing your holiday.
- 4. Members may make as many bags as they wish, but only 1 may be entered in the contest or be eligible for a prize.
- 5. The bag must be made entirely by a guild member.
- 6. Each bag must be 3 layers—top, batting and backing and be guilted, not tied.
- 7. No binding required.
- 8. Embellishments must be securely attached.
- 9. Winners will receive a gift certificate: 1st \$75, 2nd \$50, 3rd \$25

Diana's notes on Sharon's pattern:

- Ribbon or twill tape is much easier than making your ties on your own.
- 2. If using a directional design, remember that each end is a top.

Other patterns are available free online, if you prefer.


Links of interest:

Current Bylaws:

ARTICLE VI Full Board

Section 2. The Full Board shall meet periodically at meetings called by the President of the organization. The Full Board shall meet no fewer than four (4) times each year.

ARTICLE IX General Meetings

Section 1. There shall be a minimum of five (5) general meetings scheduled during the year: September, November, January, March, and May.

Proposed Change:

ARTICLE VI Full Board

Section 2. The Full Board shall meet periodically at meetings called by the President of the organization. The Full Board shall meet no fewer than three (3) times each year.

ARTICLE IX General Meetings

Section 1. There shall be a minimum of eight (8) general meetings scheduled during the year: September, October, November, January, February, March, April, and May.
