The meeting closed at 9:15 and after clean up, we were gone by 9:30.



Moda fabrics and Fat Quarter Shop have partnered for a unique charitable project. An unusual Block of the Month, quilters purchase the quilt kit online, make blocks according to online monthly videos, and Moda will match the donations up to \$10,000 to Make-a-Wish Foundation.

35 women stitched 150 quilts over 3 months as part of an artwork display at the Mumbai airport. Titled "Wrapping the Runway", the display was sewn late at night or early morning, as these Indian women mostly work as domestic help by day.

2013-2014 FAT QUARTERS THEMES

March - Stripes or Polka dots

May – Batiks

Because the price of fabric has increased, we feel it is only fair the number of tickets should also increase. Therefore, for every fat quarter you bring in, you will now receive 6 tickets instead of 2. If you are wearing a name tag and pay \$1.00 you will receive 2 tickets. If you bring in a guest you will receive 1 ticket. Tickets may be purchased for \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00

Please bring only the **highest quality fat quarters** found at our local quilt shops. Bring the quality of fabric you would like to win, because, after all, you may just win it. There are winners at every meeting and one of them could be you. We would like to thank all of you who participated in the fat quarter raffle and the fat quarter challenge last year. The fat quarter raffle is only one of the ways we use to raise funds for our guild, to help pay for our expenses and our speakers.

Also thanks to those of you who brought in pop tabs. Ronald Mc Donald House was very grateful for our donation of pop tabs, so, we will continue to collect them this year. Each year nearly 500 families of sick children stay at the Ronald McDonald house. Our pop tabs help by providing food and a temporary, home-away-from-home for these families. Please bring pull tabs from: (pop, beer, pet food, fruit & vegetable and soup cans) to our meetings. If you don't have them, maybe you could ask family, friends and neighbors to save them for you. More tabs for Ronald and less in the landfill is a very good thing. It is only because of you, and your generosity, and the support of all of our members that our guild will continue to be the great guild that it is. After all, a club is only as good, as its members. GATHERING OF QUILTERS 2013-2014 CHALLENGE

THERE'S A ZEBRA ON THE RUN

This year, your challenge is to make a black and white table runner or a bed runner. Hence the name: There's a zebra's on the run.

You must use black and white fabrics along with the focal fabric in the color, of the color paint chip that you will choose. You may add other colors as well, but the focal fabric color must be prominent on the top of the runner. Runner sizes are usually 24 inches, or less wide, by whatever length is needed to go across your table or bed plus some overhang. However you are NOT limited by size.

Any technique is permissible- pieced, appliqué, fused, thread painting etc. Mixed media is welcome, but not required. You may embellish.

Runners must have three layers (top, batting, and backing) and be hand or machine quilted. Not tied. Voting, by the membership, will take place at the May 15th meeting. The winners will receive the following:

- >1st Place \$75 gift certificate for a local quilt shop
- >2nd Place \$50 gift certificate for a local quilt shop
- >3rd Place \$25 gift certificate for a local quilt shop

Please respect the spirit of the challenge and only enter a project that was made by you for this challenge.

Use your imagination. Let's have some fun and get those zebras on the run.
